

Environmental Responsibility Statement

Badr El Jundi, as a commercial art gallery, framed in the cultural sector, with a global reach and intellectual diversity through our programme, we work towards a positive impact on the environment through our reflective actions. Sustainability is strongly connected with gallery principles. Badr El Jundi, the founder of the gallery, is the CEO and founder of Greenverse Partners Ltd, a company that supports the global transition to clean, safe, and affordable energy. Maria Gracia de Pedro, the director of the gallery, is part of the founding group of Gallery Climate Coalition Spain (GCC Spain).

As a small company, our environmental impact is low. Nevertheless, we are committed to reducing the waste that we produce, being energy efficient, and recycling everywhere possible. Our aim is to be in line with Gallery Climate Coalition (GCC) guidelines and arts sector targets to reduce our carbon emissions by 50% by 2030 (Agenda 2030) when compared to our 2022 baseline, as it's the second year that we use the carbon calculator. We will reduce the use of plastic in our logistics, using recycled materials.

We are in the process of finding partners that follow sustainable practices, controlling their acts, and that their statement aligns with the individual responsibility we should acknowledge as humans living on the earth. All our operations and business practices will be grounded in sustainability principles and our goal is to improve the environment in our community by working with area businesses, community leaders, and our neighbors to create a clean and safe place to live and work.

To ensure we meet our commitments we have:

- Organized bi-weekly meetings between the founder and the director to oversee our internal sustainability strategy, objectives, and performance.
- Established an internal green ambassador responsible for driving performance against the strategy and objectives set after the bi-weekly meetings of the founder and the director. Working on understanding how to reduce the local transportation and finding new alternatives to move when the necessity of individual transportation arises.
- Developed an active network thanks to GCC Spain, that implements local and national environmental initiatives in support of the global strategy.

As a conclusion, we are committed to keeping Badr El Jundi's environmental impact low. In 2024 we are committed to changing our packing systems, reducing waste, and minimizing local and air travel when possible. We will present the 2024 footprint results in early 2025.
